Coordination meeting with CG Viklang manch

Coordination meeting with CG viklang manch was commence with welcoming of all the members CG Viklang manch and Jan manav vikalg sangh, Baloda Bazar. Followed by Introduction of participants and introduction of GRIHINI and Sightsavers project CG social inclusion programme by Mr. Pranay George, District program manager he highlight the objective of project and till date what project has achieved in Balodabazar district. After that CG viklang Manch member share their experience what strategies they adopt for the achievement of their objective then balodabazar Jan manav viklang Sangh share their experience.

After that they discuss about what problem they face while doing advocacy and what can be done in order to remove barrier. After that Mrs. Rupa Shrivastava, Director, Grihini ask CG viklang manch to collaborate with Jan manav viklang manch. Then selection is done form each block in which member from Jan Manav Viklang Manch Plari- Ghanshyam Sahu, Simga- Tunendra Sahu, Balodabazar- Kamal Narayan, BhatPara- Devdas Tandan were selected with the concent of all member of Sangh and CG viklang Manch explain about role and responsibility. This will help them to do advocacy at state level.

In next session members CG Viklang manch and Jan manav vikalg sangh manach prepare action plan in which the decided that they will submit an application in the month of September for formation of PWDs Act 2016 at state level to Women and Child Development Minster Smt. Ramshila Sahu and Social welfare department Director Mr.Sanjay Aalam .They also prepare action plan to do accessibility audit of all government buildings such as bus stop, railway station, bank, school, anganwadi etc. For that they delegate responsibility to each one at panchayt level, Block Level, District level, State Level and they will prepare report of accessibility audit and they will submit at district and state level to respective government officials for making accessible environment for PWDs.

At the end of the coordination meeting a group photo was taken. This was followed by vote of thanks.



EXPOUSER VISIT

THE GOAT TRUST, LUCKNOW

Day 1

The training programme commence with introduction of participants and resource persons. Then Dr. Ashish explain how to identify healthy and unhealthy goat. He also discuss about characteristics of good goat such as soft skin, size of stomach, Shiny hair etc. After he mention about health issue and he mention characteristic of goat. He also explains digestive system of goat.





Highlight few points:

- Different parts of goat stomach -Rumen,obemisum,recticulam,omesium.
- Rumen movement- 3 times in 2 minutes.
- Heat cycle- 21 days remains for 48 hrs.
- Pregnancy period is of five months.
- Goat can give birth to minimum 2 kids.
- Respiration rate commonly 12-15 per minute
- Heart beat- 70-80 per minute
- Body temperature- 101-103 degree F.
- Deficiency of blood can be known by eyes.
- Ideal age of breeding buck is 14 months.
- Chest is broad in male goats.



In next session Mr. Sanjeev, Director highlights important activity which can be done by PWDs easily. After that he highlight Kids nursery rearing goat kids of high genetic worth (post milk feeding of 90 days) under semi stall feeding condition for six months and ensure supply of quality goats and bucks in the village and area is key business and breed promotion goat of Kid Nursery. Trained PWDs procure 5 to 10 kids of best quality goats of the village and rearers it under optimum management to get good growth and earns significantly through sale of such quality goats and bucks.

Supply of quality goat and buck is one of essential component to strengthen goat based livelihoods. Ironically as kids of high quality goats grows fast and local butchers pays a higher premium price in



comparison to low growth kids, goat farmers most often tend to sale such high quality male and female kids. This depletes genetic quality of goats in the village and large herd size goat farmers are not able to rear kids properly.

Such kids can be reared by landless families under intensive management system and as growth rate is high, Feed conversion ratio is best at this stage. In line to plant nurseries where high quality plants are grown under controlled condition, this concept provides ideal condition to grow such kids and sold as genetic material for further propagation in the area.

In next session Mr Arun Verma explain about procedure of Pashu Aahar, Pahu Chat and discuss its benefit also







Benefit Pashu Ahar:

- Healthy goat
- Gain weight
- Proper nutrition

Benefit of Pashu Chhat:

By using this goat can be saved from any disease which is related stomach and digestive system.

Day 2:

Second day started with making of Herbal Mashala in which Mr. Arun Kumar share the method and its benefit with PWDs.

In order to save goat from above disease only 100gm one time one month is given to one goat

In next session Dr. Ashish discuss about vaccination of goat and why it is necessary he also mention that vaccination help to fight with any disease. Then he highlights few diseases which are commonly found in goat.

Disease:

- Communicable and non-communicable.
- PPR- symptoms of PPR:
 Watering from nose and eyes,swelling in eyes,body temperature will rise upto 105 degree(normal 103 degree), diarohea,white spot on tongue, breathing problem. (These all occurs in one day)
- FMD- Foot and mouth disease.(It occurs when weather changes)
- E.T- Entro toxemia
- Brucolisis
- Pox



Dr Ashish said that in order to save from above mention disease vaccination is done on monthly basis.

Month	Name of vaccination	Quantity	Method

Vaccination criteria:

- Vaccination is done for 4 month and above kid goat.
- No vaccination is done for goat which is pregnant, affected by any disease, weak.
- Vaccination timing morning and evening

And he also discuss about symptoms of different disease which are mostly found in goats.

PPR

Symptoms

- High fever
- Mouth ulcers
- Loose motion
- Cold and coughs
- Red eye

ET

Mostly occur during rainy season

Symptoms

- Loose motion
- Paralysis
- High fever

Foot and Mouth disease

Symptoms

- Wound in mouth, foot

- Mouth ulcers
