Backyard poultry inter SHG cross visit

One day Exposure visit on Backyard Poultry was organised at District Balodabazar Palari Block at Jigyasha Divyang SHG on 6.03.2019. In which 31 PWDs SHG members from 10 SHGs from Balodabazar district four block (Simga, Palari, Bhatapara, Balodabazar) took part. The main objective of this exposure visit is to impart knowledge related to management Backyard Poultry among all SHG members so that they can also start Backyard poultry.

The exposure visit commence with introduction of participant then after PWDs SHG members explain how they are managing Backyard poultry in their SHG and members said that backyard poultry production can be easily boost up with improved varieties of chicken and can promise a better production of meat and egg. To improve the socio economic status of the person with disabilities, backyard poultry is a handy enterprise with low- cost initial investment, but high economic returns. SHG member also describe why they opt for Backyard poultry and mention few points Low initial investment but higher economic return, a unit can be started with as low as two chicken to a large flock, and feed cost is negligible due to better utilization of agriculture by product and leftover feed and grain. Egg and bird can be sold in local market with high price, because there is a going demand for local chicken and consumer are willing to pay higher price for higher quality desi chicken meat or egg, Backyard poultry farming act as an ATM, because as per need of members bird and egg can be sold at any time anywhere with cash in hand, Quality of chicken and egg is better in term of organic farming as the bird are raised in stress less environment with natural input.



Then Jigyasha divyang SHG members discuss some of the important characteristics of good chicken such as attractive and coloured plumage, escaping capacity from predators, disease resistance, hardy in nature, mothering ability, adaptability in village condition etc.

SHG members also describe about health management and said that the diseases that mostly effect can be cure through regular vaccination, deworming. Housing management and said that no housing is required for

backyard poultry farming but it should protect the bird from rain, sun, and predator and suggest that poultry house must have bulb fitted above to keep chicks warm. And In backyard poultry the feed cost is considered to be minimum, because chicks are loose for scavenging in open yard which minimize feed cost.

At last interaction session conducted in which participants asks Jigyasha divyang SHGs members how they are managing backyard poultry at their home and what challenges face by them and how they overcome challenges. They also ask beneficiary how they are doing marketing of chicken and at what rate.

Feedback at the end of the Exposer visit followed by vote of thanks this was followed by group



Orientation of newly form SHG and livelihood promotion with NRLM

A one day NRLM orientation workshop was organised by Grihini at Yog Bhavan, Balodabazar for Newly form person with disability Self Help group. In this 25 participants from 15 SHGs of all four block of Palri, Balodabazar Simga, Bhatapara of Balodabazar district were present. The main objective of this workshop is to aware SHG members on management of their SHGs, NRLM guideline. The session start with introduction of participants and NRLM Master trainers Mr. Vikash kumar Patel , Janki Patel.

After that Vikash Kumar, Master Trainer describe the term SHG to all the participants and said that A self Help Group is a voluntary association of people which function democratically and accountably to attain the collective goal of the group. And said that mission of NRLM is “to reduce poverty by enabling the poor households to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities, resulting in appreciable increase in their incomes, on a sustainable basis through building strong grassroots institutions of the poor. He mention that Disabled people, groups can be formed with minimum 5 members. One by one Both trainer describe roles and responsibilities of the group to person with disability SHG members and highlights some important points which every SHG members must know and said that it is best way to conduct weekly and it is essential for all the members to particiapte in the group meeting they must sit in circle while conducting meeting, Meeting agenda should be prepared and the meeting



should be convened according. In meeting a minimum of 90% members should participate in the meeting and the decisions should be written in the resolution book, read to all the members and only then their signatures should be received in that. Then he also describe importance of person with disability SHG to all participants and focus on roles and responsibility of SHGs members and key office bearers for smooth functioning of their SHGs.

Master trainer then said that two types of benefits can be received by PWDs by joining the self-help group. They are financial benefits and non-financial benefits

A) Non-financial benefits

- Unity among people will be strengthened
- Self-confidence increases
- Transparency in all activities
- Equal rights and be given equal opportunities
- Leads to self-development
- Can get different kinds of information
- Social security and recognition received
- Can participate in the social development

B) Financial benefits

- Saving habit starts. People can save the maximum they can
- Emergency financial needs fulfilled
- Avoid from being stuck with high interest rates of local money lenders
- It's helpful to improve existing business and can grow through new business ventures

After that master trainer described 11 Sutra of NRLM for SHGs. And said that financial Assistance to the SHGs will be provided under NRLM as Revolving Fund (RF) support to SHGs in existence for a minimum period of 3/6 months and follow the norms of good SHGs, i.e. they follow '11 sutra'. Only such SHGs that have not received any RF earlier will be provided with RF, as corpus, with a minimum of ₹10,000 and up to a maximum of ₹15,000 per SHG. The purpose of RF is to strengthen their institutional and financial management capacity and build a good credit history within the group. And Community Investment support Fund (CIF) CIF will be provided to the SHGs. The CIF will be used, by the Federations, to advance loans to the SHGs and/or to undertake the common/collective socio-economic activities.

Mrs Janki Patal, Master trainer describe the eligibility criteria for the SHGs to avail loans and said SHG should be in active existence at least since the last 6 months as per the books of account of SHGs and not from the date of opening of S/B account, SHG should be practicing '11 sutras' Qualified as per grading norms fixed by NABARD. As and when the federations of the SHGs come to existence, the grading exercise can be done by the federations to support the Banks.

After that Q&A session conducted by Master trainer in which participants ask different question regarding their existing SHGs they also ask what are the different livelihood option available for Person with Disability which require less investment. This was followed by thanks giving and group photograph.



Inclusive Election campaign

Grihini with support of Sightsavers organize inclusive election campaign in Balodabazar district in collaboration with Jan Manav Viklang Kalyan Sangh, Social Welfare Department and District Election Commission Balodabazar. The main objective of this campaign is to motivate and sensitize PWDs to vote for their rights and ensure that a person with a disability can vote without any hassles. During this campaign, a total of 358 PWDs (Female: 117, Male: 241) were aware (including all four blocks). In this campaign, District Magistrate, Upper Collector, District CEO, Director Social Welfare Department, District Election Commission Officer, Block CEO were also present.



The program started with welcoming participants and government officials, followed by a master trainer who presented a video clip on accessible elections for PWDs. The District Magistrate stated that this time, polling booths will be made accessible, and all necessary arrangements will be made available at every polling booth, such as wheelchairs, wheelchair ramps, sign language interpreters for deaf people, and guides for visually impaired people throughout the election process, so that PWDs can vote for their rights. The DM also motivated all PWDs to vote in the Lok Sabha election on 23.4.2019 and told PWDs to motivate other PWDs to come out from their homes and do voting. After that, the District Magistrate conducted an oath-taking ceremony for all participants.



After that, a small role play was done by DPO members to aware

government official what problem they face by them how people interacted with them in their village, what problem they face during voting and in voting booth by Person with disability.

Mrs. Asha Shukla, Director, Social welfare department also said election commission of India said that “Leave no voter Behind” with special focus on PWDs and the theme of inclusion of PWDs has been given a special focus in the election commission of India Strategic plan 2016- 2025. At last she said our vote is our power let’s make sure we use it, and we all have to vote in every year election. She said that if any PWDs reach to any polling booth they are not required to stay in queue they are given special preference is given by election officer. She also said that election commission is proactive and they are not leaving anyone to ensure maximum participation of people with all kind of disabilities for the upcoming election.

Then master trainer from election commission describe election procedure and enlightened people about polling booth timing, documents they need to carry and describe what are the different facility were made available to PWDs in polling booth then they demonstrate how to use VVPAT machine they also demonstrate how to use braille in VVPAT machine to blind person and also conduct demo session for PWDs who are using wheelchair.

At the end of campaign DPOs were asked by Social welfare department to submit details of polling booth of their block which is not accessible so that they can be made accessible before election. At last thanks given was done which was followed by group photographs.

District Level DPO meeting: District level Gender committee formation

Jan Manav Kalyan sangh meeting was organized by at Yog Bhawan in which total 39 person with disability from Balodabazar district four block Bhatapara, Simga, Palari, Balodabazar took part (Female:12, Male: 13) main objective of this meetings was to form District level Gender committee in Balodabazar District which mainly focus on women with disability so that their participation increase. The meeting was headed by Rimpa Verma state DPO coordinator, EU.

Meeting start with introduction of all the participants after that State DPO coordinator ask PWDs what they understand about the term Gender then DPO one by one share their view after that she also define the term Gender in simple word and said Gender is a socially constructed definition of women and men. It is not the same as sex (biological characteristics of women and men) and it is not the same as women. Gender is determined by the conception of tasks, functions and roles attributed to women and men in society and in public and private life. Rimpa Verma then said PWDs that by forming gender committee they can aware women with disability on gender equality, domestic violence and empower women with disability so that they can come out from their home and ask for their rights. She also aware that committee member will identify issue like domestic violence, harassment. After that Women DPO were asked to share what problem face by them in their family and society they one by one they share their experience. State DPO coordinator told that in order to solve problem face by women with disability committee member will visit her family personally and try to change their perception so that it will help women who are suffering from violence to live dignified better life.
