State Level DPO meeting

Venue : Samarth in Raipur at SAMETI, Zora Date : 21 may2019 , 22 (Male- 14, Female-8)

A one day state level meetings was organised by Sightsavers in collaboration with Grihini and Samarth in Raipur at SAMETI, Zora. In this meeting 22 (Male- 14, Female-8) participants from balodabazar, Mahasamund, Raipur took part. Session start with introduction of participants. Meeting was facilitated by Mr Gaurav Jain, Project officer and State DPO coordinator Mrs Rimpa Verma . State DPO coordinator share the objective of meeting then DPO were asked what common problem faced by person with disability in getting Ration and Pension. DPOs from different district one by one explain the status of Ration and Pension in their respective district and block. Few said they are not getting pension regularly they receive pension in gap of 2-3 month and DPO also mention that sometimes pension receive by them in hand not in their respective bank account, they also highlight that PWDs who belongs to APL are not getting green ration card, They suggest that PWD who belongs to APL must add their name in green ration card and can get same benefit as BPL beneficiary are receiving in green ration card. In addition to this project officer said in order to overcome problem DPO must need to collect data regarding pension and ration, so that they can do evidence based advocacy at state, district and block level to respective government department so that all person with disability beneficiary can avail benefit easily without any barrier.

In next session project officer focus on survey format and explain how they can collect data of beneficiary regarding ration and pension then one by one he explain all question so that it will help DPO to understand well.

Then facilitator also explain do's and don'ts which every surveyor must follow while collecting information in the field from beneficiary. At last group demo session was conducted in which DPOs were taught how to ask question to collect information while conducting survey.

At the end of program timeline was given to all DPOs to complete study before 20th June. This Photos can tell the story for you- take high resolution images to support your event. District Block Level & advocacy Meeting

Venue: Yog Bhavan Balodabazar Date : 06 may2019 , total 16 (Male- 11, Female-6)

7 DPO from balodabazar attain state level DPO meeting at Samati, Zora Raipur. Meeting focused on conducting survey of Ration/Pension for DPO members in their respective district.

District level DPO is now going to conduct small study for Ration and Pension in Balodabazar district 4 block (Bhatapara,Simga ,palari,Balodabazar) In which they will conduct survey of 200 beneficiary 50 each from all block. At last DPO will submit report to respective government department and do evidence based advocacy.

In order to support PWDs SHG in their livelihood activity DPO will do advocacy with government/ private agencies CSR to provide necessary support such as packaging, marketing of products, allotment of shop etc so that they can run their enterprise easily.

DPO will also do advocacy with zila Panchayt CEO for giving preference to person with disability SHGs for giving them tender of Market tax collection.



Case Story

Jigayasa divyang SHG is a Person with disability group at Balodabazar. The group was formed in the year 2016 with a membership of three female and five male. This SHG's experience proves how PWDs with the help of the cooperative principles organize themselves to beat poverty and despair. Jigayasa divyang SHG members said the primary purpose of self-help groups is to improve the socio-economic status Person with disability (PWDs), especially to increase their income. The PWDs were informed by Grihini associates about the process of group formation and the benefits that would arise from such group formation. Observing their interest for formation of a SHG to develop their socio-economic condition the Grihini associate took initiative in formation of the group and also guided them for opening an account in the bank and register them in NRLM. All the members decided to conduct a monthly meeting of SHG, and decided that each member would deposit an amount of Rs100/- per month. In the monthly meeting the contributions mobilised and money deposited in the bank every month so that members of the groups can take loan when needed. The members of the group are primarily engaged in doing marketing of agarbatti which was produced by other nearby PWDs SHGs. By doing this they can somehow earn very less and contribute in their group. The group is progressing day by day in order to contribute more in group they decided to opt for enrolling their SHG name for weekly Market tax collection tender for that they also did advocacy with gram panchayat and through auction they are selected for Market tax collection tender for one year and now group is doing very well during the span of one year they earn profit of Approx. Rs 23,000 yearly. After seeing interest in 2018 SHG members got an opportunity to attain three days backyard exposure visit which was organized by Grihini at The goat trust Lucknow where they learn how to do management of poultry so that they can get better return very efficiently and effectively. The members also receive training from animal husbandry department. After exposure visit and training their SHG apply for chicks in Animal husbandry department, balodabazar they also receive good breed of chicks in subsidy. They receive 2 unit 90 chick @300 each unit. Ninety eight percent birds were survived during the period of six months of rearing. Now they are selling birds @350 per kg till now group has earned profit of Rs 30,000. At present Jigayasa divyang SHG is having savings of Rs 60,000. SHGs success motivated the other PWDs SHGs of district for initiating backyard poultry farming with improved variety of birds and made them self-sustainable
